Biography

Fabienne GOUX-BAUDIMENT earned a Masters in Political Science (France) and a PhD in Human and Social Foresight (Social Sciences, Roma, Italy). Futurist, she has been the founding head of the consulting firm [proGective](#) in France (Paris) since 1994; center of application, research and training in futures studies, proGective meets its clients' needs (either central or local governments, businesses, NGOs) by working out innovative and foresight-oriented solutions. A member of the Foresight section of the Economic, Social and Environmental Regional Council of Ile de France (Paris), she also is Associate Professor of Foresight and Innovation, and coordinator of the curriculum "Knowledge Engineer" at the University of Angers.

Former President of the WFSF (2005-2009), she has served as founding President of the French Society for Foresight (2013-2016).

Author and referee, Fabienne is also a member of the Association of Professional Futurists and the World Future Society, and a Fellow of the World Futures Studies Federation.

Main works

During the last decade, she has mainly worked on the future of energy, education and urbanization, and broadly in the comprehensive field of public policy.

More recently, she shifted from territorial foresight, her 20-year specialization, to global foresight in order to dedicate herself to the upper-scale topic of the Great Transition. Currently she is working (R&D and experimentation) to develop the concept of Humanrithm as the needed convergence between the Alien Generation, the VUCA world and the exponential automatization (algorithms and robots).

Her quarterly chronicles in the French journal RH&M (Human Resources & Management) reflect the diversity of her futuring work. Her next book, related to the Great Transition, will be published at the end of 2016.
